REAR FACE AS LONG AS POSSIBLE

While Spring might be a season for change, don't change the direction your child is facing in the car too soon.


Rear facing in a car seat better protects a child's head, neck, and spine in the event of a crash. Keep your child's car seat rear facing until your child reaches the height or weight limits of that position in the car seat.

GROWTH SPURT?

Kids seem to *spring* up a few extra inches overnight. But just because they're taller, doesn't mean they're ready for the front seat.

Until puberty (approx. 13 years old) the bones aren't strong enough to withstand the impact of an airbag.

Keep your children safe, keep them in the back seat until they are 13 years old
