The Licking County Health Department's Screening and Survival Support (SASS) for Breast Cancer program provides mammogram assistance to women in need as well as assistance and support for women living with breast cancer. The program serves women throughout Licking County. SASS' mission is to educate the public on the importance of early detection as a key to breast cancer survival and help those diagnosed with breast cancer maintain and improve their quality of life.



Your risk of breast cancer is not entirely out of your control? Your family history does matter, but there are many lifestyle choices that can lower your risk of breast cancer including:

- · Regular Exercise
- · Healthy Diet
- · Maintaining a Healthy Weight
- Managing Stress
- Smoking Cessation/Quitting Smoking
- Reduced Alcohol Consumption
- Think carefully/speak with your doctor about using hormone replacement therapy (HRT)

The Child Injury Prevention (CIP) Program focuses on reducing injuries through education and activities revolving around bicycle safety, car seat safety and traumatic brain injuries (TBI) such as concussions.

In addition to providing education on the above topics, the CIP program also provides free car seats to eligible families as well as free bicycle helmets to children.



Did you know?

A child's body temperature rises <u>3-5x</u> faster than an adult's.

When left in a hot vehicle, a child's temperature can rise quickly — and they could die in minutes. It never hurts to double check your back seat, it could save a life.

Message from the Creating Healthy Communities (CHC) Coordinator

In 2020, the Licking County Health Department (LCHD) was one of 23 counties in Ohio to receive the Creating Healthy Communities (CHC) grant for a 5-year cycle from 2020-2024. The grant funding comes from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention's (CDC) Preventive Health and Health Services Block Grant which aims to prevent and reduce chronic disease throughout the state of Ohio. These funds, which are estimated to be \$100,000 annually, are administrated by the Ohio Department of Health (ODH).

There is a *Licking County Wellness Coalition (LCWC)*! The LCWC was founded in 2006 as a result of the Community Blueprint. DRUG OVERDOSE PREVENTION

LCHD's Drug Overdose Prevention (DOP) program works to implement comprehensive community-based efforts to address drug use and misuse through: coalition development, community needs assessment and evaluation, formation of an overdose fatality review, and development of policy, systems and environmental change strategies to address the issue. LCHD also provides free naloxone (NARCAN) kits. NARCAN is a medication that can be used to reverse an opioid overdose.

NICOTINE USE PREVENTION

Message from the Nicotine Use Prevention Coordinators

In 2019, the Licking County Health Department was awarded the Tobacco Use and Cessation Program grant for a 3 year cycle from 2019-2022. The Program has three main goals: preventing youth and young adults from initiating the use of nicotine products, helping adults access tobacco cessation services, and working to pass policies that limit the accessibility/availability of tobacco products and reduce exposure to secondhand smoke. These funds, which are estimated to be around \$100,000 annually, are administrated by Ohio Department of Health.



Tobacco-Free Policy

Healthier workers are more productive workers. A Tobacco-Free Policy in the workplace protects all employees, reduces litter on the property, and having fewer smokers leads to lower insurance rates. The Tobacco Use Reduction Network (TURN) Coalition is working towards creating a Licking County where all community members can live healthy, tobacco and nicotine-free lives. TURN collaborates with community partners to reduce tobacco and nicotine use and dependence in Licking County by providing resources, education, services, and support to promote health outcomes. In November 2013, TURN was re-established with the goal of reducing the adult smoking rate in Licking County from 26% to 13% by 2023.
